Board of Selectmen Corner


The Board of Selectmen encourages residents to attend the Special and Annual Town Meeting on Monday, May 11th starting at 7:00 p.m. at the Dighton Rehoboth High School. We encourage you to read your Warrants, which were delivered to every home two (2) weeks before the start of Town Meeting.

The Board and State Representative Steve Howitt have worked hard to secure a \$2 million dollar allocation under the Transportation Bond Bill for the redesign, realignment, re-signalization and reconstruction of the Rt. 44 and Rt. 118 intersection. The Selectmen will host a public meeting on Tuesday, May 26th with state officials at 7:00 p.m. at the Senior Center, if Town meeting has concluded. The State needs to hear from the public if this is really an important project. Please consider attending or send along written comments.

Bids for the Wheeler Street Bridge Project will be received at the Massachusetts Department of Transportation on May 5th.

The Commission has recently received a Notice of Intent for a small commercial solar farm at the former G&W Foundry. The Commission has also been very busy with wetland violations. Please be aware that if you are proposing any activities within 100' of a wetland resource area or 200' of perennial stream, you must first contact the Conservation Commission.
