Town Administration Office Updates:

On September 4th Debbie Arruda attend the ABCC Seminar in Mansfield. The process to apply or make changes to a license are the same, except for "Transfer of License," current owner will have to provide documentation from Department of Revenue that they have been compliant with payment of their employees' taxes.

On Friday, September 6, 2019 Debbie will begin her first round of classes in Hyannis for her MMA Certificate. Program will run for 25 "Fridays" ending on May 15, 2020. There were about 40 attendees, mostly from the Cape Cod area.

Action Item #2: Chapter 90 Reimbursement Request

Chapter 90 Reimbursement request was for work completed earlier this summer on Mason St, Wheeler St, Sweeney Rd, and Willard Ave. Project approved by MassDot and reviewed by our accountant. The total of the reimbursement is \$525,947.247

D. Perry motion to approve the Chapter 90 Reimbursement Request in the amount of \$525,947.27. Second by J. Muri. Vote 4-0 (M. Costello abstained).

Action Item #3: Utility Installer License

J. Muri motion to approve the Utility Installer License Application and process as presented. Second by D. Perry. Vote 5-0

Discussion:

Application approval gives the applicant permission to work in town, NOT to open the road. The installer will need to apply for a Road Opening Permit in order to actually do the work.

License stays with the company, not the installer. If the installer leaves the company, the license approval stays with the company and is good for one year.

The fee paid is a yearly fee not per job fee.

Applicant will have to provide information on Certificate of Insurance (COI) and provide a copy of their current hoisting license.

A copy of the application will be provided to the Board of Health and the Building Dept.

Action Item #4: Regional Energy Planning Assistance Grant Award

The town received a grant in the amount of \$8,800.00 that will cover the costs of becoming a "Green Community" and for the preparations of future grant applications and activities. This is a program that is under SRPEDD. There is no cost to the Town for any services rendered.

J. Muri motion to authorize the Chairman to execute the Regional Energy Planning Assistance Grant Award on behalf of the town. Second by S. Vadnais. Vote 5-0

Action Item #5: Request from Dighton Selectmen to Resume Quarterly Meetings

The Board was in agreement to reinstate the quarterly meetings with the Dighton Board of Selectmen. In the past there were very good discussion between both boards. Chairman Schwall will review the upcoming schedule for November and a letter will be sent out to the Dighton Board inviting them to one of the Rehoboth BOS meetings in late November.
