Historic Records Preservation

From 1850 - 1993, wood pulp paper was used. It is extremely acidic, and unstable.





- From early times until about 1850, natural fibers such as cotton was used to make paper. The paper is fairly stable, but the inks fade quickly.
- From 1700s and 1800s, Iron gall ink was commonly used. The ink has its own very corrosive qualities, and increases the sensitivity of the paper to light, humidity and pollutants eventually burning through the paper.



Preservation minimizes the chemical and physical deterioration of the page and text.

Its goal is to prolong the existence and useful life of the original format.

Oftentimes, this includes preserving and removing the original from public access and creating a security copy. Preservation can incorporate any combination of conservation, treatment, stabilization, preventative care, or digitization.

DO IT ONCE, DO IT RIGHT, DO IT forever

We don't charge maximum prices for our services. Instead, we custom price each individual book based on its particular condition and needs. This allows counties to address more historical volumes without spending needless monies.

One page (one side of a sheet) with any recorded information (script, type, stamp, etc.) is priced at a base rate of \$4.00. This price will raise to approximately \$8.00 based on a series of assessment markers. For 640 page volumes with significant tape removal required, a conservator will require an average of 36 hours to remove the tape and adhesives. Tape removal is just one step in the process.

DOCUMENTATION

Upon receipt, items are assessed to document condition prior to service. Each sheet is inspected by to ensure that it receives the appropriate level of treatment.

REMOVAL of OLD REPAIRS

The removal method of old repairs/adhesives and pressure sensitive tape is dependent upon the type of tape, condition of the page, and presence of potentially soluble media. The primary method is immersion in a solvent bath. An alternative is the local application of solvent or the mechanical removal (which is followed by erasing of adhesive residue or application of heat).





The yellowed and brittle acidic tape quickly piles up as the technician works.





Sheet extenders appear innocent. However, removal is a long and arduous process. Each pile pictured above represents the sheet extenders removed from a single historic volume.

Acid used in non-archival adhesive migrates into the paper's fibers, causing stains. Instead of solving the problem, this chemical breakdown causes the paper's natural fibers to fatigue and ultimately deteriorate.







These manuscript documents were written with Iron Gall Ink. With removal, the adhesive of the sheet extenders lifts a layer of ink oxidation from the page.

The sheet extender is carefully lifted from the page. The strength of the adhesive varies from page to page. In some cases, there is more than one sheet extender applied to the page.

Particular care must be taken to not rip or tear the sheet during removal. This process demands physical labor, because the application of heat would lift the film, but not the adhesive residue.





Tape. It repairs, it protects, and it is inexpensive. True?

This 1848 Probate Record is an extreme example of the errors of the use of acidic tape.



Pictured are actually pieces of the tape removed from a historical document. The tape lifted a layer of ink from the page upon removal. If this had rendered the text unreadable, this process would have not been attempted. However, in this case, only a slight layer was lifted, not effecting legibility.

HUMIDIFICATION

Improperly stored, papers become inflexible over time. They retain a memory of the storage position (known as "Hysteresis"). Ultrasonic Humidification Treatment corrects folds and bends.



FLATTENING

The sheets are dried with acid-free blotters. Careful monitoring eliminates bleeding ink and mold or fungus growth.

deacidication (alkalization)

The application of magnesium oxide neutralizes any chemicals toxic to the life of the paper and ink. This process is only performed after careful pH & compatibility testing.





repair AND restore

Weak, brittle, badly torn, and fragmented maps are mounted on Japanese tissue, primarily Kozo or Zangetsu. Mending mildly torn maps is performed using either Japanese tissue and ethyl cellulose paste or Crompton tissue.







enCAPUSULATION

Protective housing will determine the "life or death" of records. Its composition will have a chemical reaction with paper fibers and ink. The reaction either save money or cause unmitigated expense. Encapsulation is not lamination. Lamination is non-revisable. In archival encapsulation, the document is free floating. It is not adhered or heat set.

Polyester or Polyethylene Terephthalate (PET) is the most inert, rigid, dimensionally stable (dimstab), and strongest plastic film. It is crystal clear, smooth, and has no odor. While it is the most expensive, PET's non-damaging properties deem it the superior choice for long-term storage by Archivists. It will not distort or melt in case of fire. The inherent static cling of SKC SH725 polyester provides physical support and protection from daily public use.

Sheets are encapsulated in a custom patented Lay Flat Archival Polyester PocketTM.







The DSB features a lifetime warranty against rust—the number one failure of competitors. It provides progressive protection from exposure to fire, water, Relative Humidity (RH), atmospheric pollutants, ultraviolet (UV) light, impact, and drops. A security lock hinge protects from theft. Also, the DSB is equipped with a Polyester Foam Insert, which ensures physical support to the book block and allows library style storage that reduces storage space. The DSB also creates a *Microclimate*, an independent, stable environment separating sheets from the external atmosphere.









This record is now deacidifed, free of tape, and protected by archival Japanese tissue. It is encapsulated with its original volume, and returned to the County.



MAGING

Sheets are imaged by hand, not mechanically. Each image is processed for content verification, skew correction, border removal, and optimal quality.



MICROFILMING

Each record is microfilmed at either 16MM or 35 MM.

Sheets encapsulated in archival grade polyester envelopes. Envelopes bound in record binder.
